

## General Information

### Opening Times

#### THE CLUBHOUSE

Opens at 07:30 each day and normally closes  
between 21:00 and 21:30 in the Summer and  
around 18:00 in the Winter, but this may vary  
according to planned events.

#### THE OFFICE

Open between 08:30 and 17:00, Monday to Saturday.

## In the Clubhouse

We are justifiably proud of our Clubhouse. It's a proper, traditional golf clubhouse. It's a little quirky and sometimes it shows its age. For Members, it's a home from home. For visitors it's a comfortable venue for a day's golf. As you are probably aware, we have an unparalleled reputation for our catering. We hope you will enjoy everything the clubhouse offers.

### Food and Beverage

#### BAR FOOD

Hot food is served until 15:00 in the Harry Colt Bar and the Gallery Bar on Mondays - Saturdays. Sandwiches are available until 16:00 every day including Sunday. Members wishing to have sandwiches after 16:00 should pre-order them at the bar before commencing play.

#### BANK HOLIDAYS

Catering may change on Bank Holidays - please check with the bar.

### Changing Facilities

Visitors are welcome to use the locker rooms which are in the Clubhouse. The Men's are on the ground floor, the Ladies' on the 1st floor. Codes for entry can be obtained from the Pro Shop.

### Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in any part of the clubhouse.

### Mobiles

Should be used responsibly so as not to disturb others and calls should be taken/made in the car park.

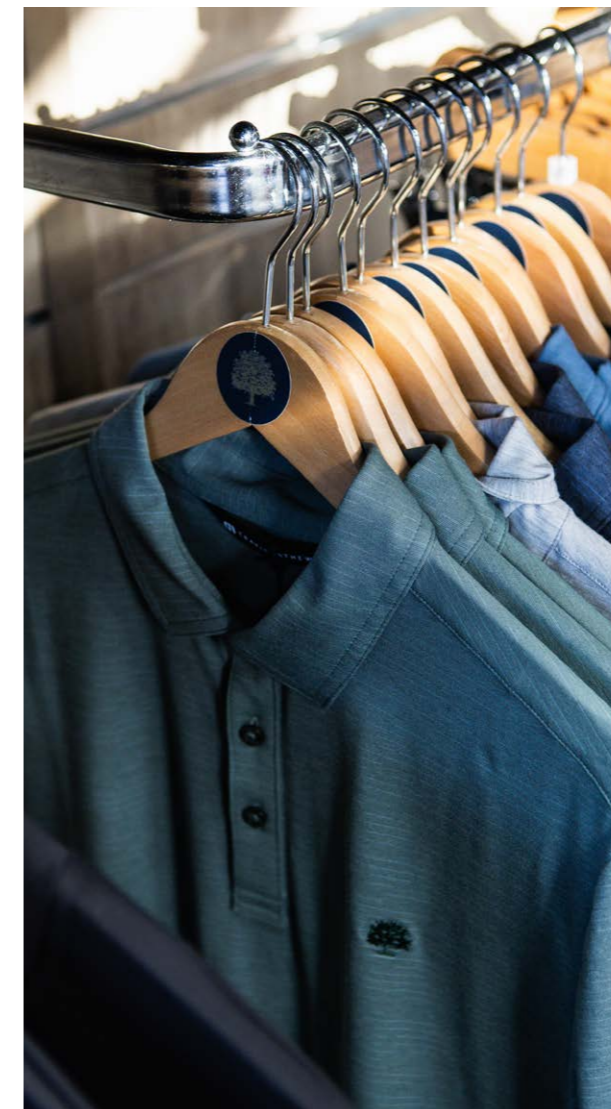
## Dress Code

We wish to maintain responsible standards of casual but smart dress in keeping with golfing traditions. We are not an old-fashioned club, nor do we wish to appear fuddy-duddy. However, we believe people choose to join Tandridge because they expect certain standards to be maintained. As a visitor, we would ask that you respect those standards.

On the Golf Course & Practice Ground we ask all golfers to wear the type of golf clothing that can be purchased in quality golf shops.

Smart, casual wear is requested in and around the Clubhouse, including the lounge and dining room.

Appropriate footwear should be worn both on and off the Golf Course.



## We allow

Tailored shorts on the course, the patio and in the Clubhouse

Clean golfing shoes and clothes in the Harry Colt bar

Smart jeans in the Harry Colt Bar and Gallery Bar only

## We do not allow

Headgear in the Clubhouse

Tracksuits, t-shirts, cargo or combat trousers, rugby and football shirts

Flip Flops, Crocs or Birkenstocks

Changing clothing in the car park, wet/muddy clothing or shoes in any bar area

## We ask that

Shirts are tucked-in at all times, unless designed to be worn outside shorts or skirts

Short socks, when worn with shorts or skirts, should be predominantly white or the same colour as the bulk of the shoe

Athletic trainer length socks are allowed but must be white

Changing rooms are used to change shoes

Players change into clean clothing after an inclement or hot day



## Before you Play

Please arrive in plenty of time for your tee time. On arrival please check in at the pro shop and pay any outstanding green fees.

Please be at the starter's hut adjacent to the 1st tee 10 minutes before your tee time.



### Club Buggies

The Club has four single seat buggies available for hire by visitors with a medical condition where a buggy is deemed necessary for them to play golf. These can be reserved via the Professional's Shop and insurance/waiver documents must be completed before use.

### Club Trolleys

Pull and electric trolleys are available for hire from the Professional's Shop.



## Practice Facilities

### THE RANGE

Practice facilities are available on our range. For range balls, please go to the bar to obtain a code.

We have 6 new covered bays, a fantastically equipped studio and a great outside teaching area. Members can use their Bar Card to pay for balls. Visitors can obtain a bar-coded voucher from behind the bar.

The bay next to the studio has a retractable net, so if you hit your driver or any club over 200 yards, you should use this bay, with the net closed.

### PRACTICE HOLE

Located to the left of the drive, before the car park. This operates in two parts: from the mats to an area before the practice green, and on the higher level around the practice green for chipping and bunker practice. Please DO NOT hit from the mats to the practice green.

### PUTTING GREEN

By the terrace, this area is to be used only for putting and for short chips from the fringe.

### PRACTICE NETS

These are located on the right of the pathway to the first tee.





## On the Course

### Etiquette

Arrive at the tee 10 minutes before your tee time and check in with the starter if there is one on duty. Take time to confirm your Playing Handicap with your partners.

On the tee, watch your partners' drives. If they lose sight of their ball, help direct them to it and avoid any searching.

If you are unsure whether your ball has come to rest out of bounds, or may be lost, hit a provisional ball so that you won't have to return to the spot to replay the shot.

If you are searching for a lost ball and are willing to spend up to three minutes looking for it, consider allowing the group behind to play through if you will be holding them up.

When waiting on the tee or the fairway for the group in front to clear the fairway or green, don't be strict about order of play. Let the short hitter - who can't reach the group ahead anyway - go ahead and play.

Be ready to play your shot. Check your yardage, pick your club and choose your shot while the other players are playing. **BE READY TO PLAY!**

Be aware of your position with regard to the group in front and try to keep up with that group, if you feel that your group is losing ground, tell the other players in your group. If you have lost ground try to catch up.

If it is obvious that the group behind are far quicker than your group, maybe they are a 2 ball and you are a 4 ball – don't rush to stay in front, invite them to play through.

At the green, speed up your exit by positioning your bags on the way to the next tee

Begin reading the green and lining up putts as soon as you reach the green. Don't wait until it's your turn to putt to start the process of reading the green. Do it as soon as you reach the green so that when it's your turn you can step right up and putt.

Mark your scorecard after reaching the next tee, not while lingering on or near the just-completed green. If it's your honour on the tee mark the scorecard after you have hit your tee shot.

### Divots

Please ensure that all divots are replaced firmly and that divot marks on tees are filled with sand and seed, where provided.

### Pitch Marks

Please repair not only your own, but ALL pitch marks you see on all greens. A pitch mark immediately and properly repaired will recover immediately. This is vitally important.

### Bunkers

Please rake all bunkers after use and leave the rakes inside the bunker BUT with the handles outside.

### Dogs at Tandridge

Our four-legged friends are more than welcome at Tandridge. However they must be well behaved and they must, at all times, be on a lead.

Dogs, apart from guide dogs, are not allowed in the clubhouse.

We would ask that members take waste bags with them and dispose of them at home or away from the course.

### Colt Corner

Renowned architect Tim Lobb has described the 12th, 13th and 14th at Tandridge as 'one of Harry Colt's finest 3 hole sequences'. Many members describe it as Surrey's own Amen Corner. The 'Colt Corner Challenge' is to get round the the corner in 10 or less. Ladies get an extra shot on the 13th. Many have tried. Few succeed.



Even if you are playing off the yellows, take a moment or two to savour the view from the Whites at the 14th. It's one of the most spectacular in golf.
